Academic Holidays mean neither instruct on and classes are held, nor are assignments made due, on the academic holiday. If an instructor has made an assignment due on an academic holiday, then it actually is no due unt I instruct on and classes begin af er the end of the academic holiday. Of cial University holidays shall be treated as academic holidays are Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, the day following Thanksgiving Day, Mart n Luthe King's birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, the December holiday period, and Elect on Day in president a elect on years.

Operat onal guidelines that apply inst tut onal-wide and require approval only from University Counsel and the President.
Academic year means a period of t me that is at least thirty (30) weeks in length, count ng periods of t me (terms that begin on the frst day of classes (instruct on) and end on the last day of classes (instruct on) or examinat ons

Instruct onal t me consists of scheduled class t me spent in direct instruct on, assessment, and evaluat on where undergraduate or graduate students are expected to be act vely engaged in a learning act vity facilitated by the instructor on record. Instruc

Instruct onal days mean any weekday, Monday through Friday, in which classes are in session.

An academic semester means a period of t me that shall consist of no fewer than ff een (15) calendar weeks and no more than eighteen (18) calendar weeks of instruct onal t me. The inclusion of breaks or holiday within any part cular semester shall be at the discret on of the inst tut on so long as the inst tut on is in compliance with the criteria for awarding semester credit hours.

Summer session means the period in the academic calendar between the spring and the fall semester.

Academic Calendars will be constructed by the Division of Academic and Student Af airs based on the Academic Calendar Policy and published at least two years in advance or more.

Sect on 1. Organizat on of the Academic Year:

The Academic Year shall consist of a Fall Semester and a Spring Semester, each last ng at least ff een (15) instruct onal weeks and an eight (8) week Summer Session. The summer session is directly related to student needs and must adhere to a sustainable, feasible, and f scally responsible business model.

All grades for each course shall be posted in the learning management system and submit ed in WIRED/Banner or due in the Of ce of the Registrar three (3) days af er the final examination is administered for the respective course. Any approved exceptions must submit final grades by the close of business Monday immediately following the final examination period.

Sect on 2. Fall Semester:

The fall semester shall begin in time to permit completion prior to the of cial University closure for the December holiday break. The fall semester begins on the <u>second Monday of August</u>, termed week zero. Monday through Friday of week zero will be for opening conferences, academic workshops, division meetings, and faculty professional development days. In addition, the Ofice of Student Afairs may have student programmatic activities and events during week zero as published in their calendar.

- 2.2. Labor Day will be observed as an academic holiday. Therefore, instruct on will resume the following day.

Faculty are required to post mid-semester grades, including an accurate at endance record in both the learning management system and Banner, by the close of business on Friday of the mid-semester examinat on period.
