FSCC 15-16-12, deletion of Sociology courses: SOC 201 FSCC 15-16-20, new course titled EDU 101 Introduction to Education, dual credit class

FSCC 15-16-21, new course titled EDU 206 PRAXIS CASE: Mathematics Test Prep Seminar

Vice-President Bruce Grif

APC Chair Moffett presented the completed proposed policy statements to create consistency for the delivery of online course content at KSU. After extensive discussion the policy passed as written by a vote of 13 yeas, 2 nays, and 3 abstentions.

The Academic Calendar was presented with Midterm Exams week seven, beginning two weeks before Homecoming Week. Senior grades will continue to be due one week early. The calendar passed by a vote of 11 yeas, 4 nays, 2 abstentions.

Procedural issues were discussed, including the requirement for a three day interval between the motion and vote by Senate to call for a vote of the full faculty and the beginning of the voting process. The question was also raised of the protocol to announce the agenda three days prior to a meeting. Issues with electronic voting and confidentiality were discussed.

They will have a new Action Item for the next Senate meeting. One of the FY2014/15 Actions (PCC 14-15-01) that was missing in Hume Hall will need to go up again. This designates specific Midterm grades, as opposed to F or D. Secretary Rye will check if the VPAA now has that copy.

Secretary Rye asked for Senator's opinions on the nature and format of minutes. According to Robert's Rules of Order, only actions should be recorded and no attempt should be made to summarize discussion. Senators were of differing opinions and no determination was reached.

President Smith raised the question of how much money was budgeted for the consulting firms brought in. The desirability of hiring external professionals for short-term contracts was discussed.
